Creative Module Creative Corner

Creative Working on the topic of Children's Rights

In the Creative Corner module, the main goal is to present a creative and open space in which the topic of children's rights can be addressed in both a playful and creative way – for example with short skits, or by designing and painting posters, placards, or other objects. This may also include additional ideas such as putting the works of art the students produce on display (perhaps even presenting them as an exhibition).

Goals

- encouraging and promoting creativity
- representing children's rights, making them visible to the participants
- promoting community
- strengthening creative expression

Skills Intended to be Fostered

- Creativity
- The ability to make decisions
- Personal development
- Instilling tolerance for ambiguity

Resources needed

Persons: artistically talented instructors (perhaps art teachers), Youth Leaders

Time: approximately 4 hours (some steps may be omitted if necessary)

Space: A quiet and peaceful space with ample room for icebreakers, other getting-to-know-you games, and, if necessary, a space where the artworks can be exhibited.

Materials

- Acrylic paint or other permanent materials (dye, paint, etc.)
- Paner
- Pencils, permanent markers
- Cardboard boxes, placards, posters
- T-Shirts
- Ball
- Buttons and a button press for making small pins
- Balloons
- Blindfolds
- ...and whatever else helps engage creativity
- Augenbinden
